Overview

The Bureau de l'éthique clinique and the CEPPP aim to develop necessary skills for reflection, evaluation and transmission of know-how on ethical issues in healthcare. It offers a structured, coherent and unifying vision of clinical ethics and patient partnership as an inherent culture that relates to a way of being and behaving on a daily basis in partnership with patients, colleagues and society. Throughout the clinical ethics curriculum, from Doctor of Medicine to Graduate Studies, students work on their ability to analyze complex human and clinical situations experienced by clinicians, patients and families, that is, to articulate ethical reasoning around issues related to care, at the patient's bedside. Teaching of clinical ethics is grounded in clinical practice, and based on **lived experience, experiences and emotions**. This approach to ethics is part of a desire to develop transversal skills of **communication**, **collaboration**, **partnership**, **interculturalism**, **professionalism**, as the main tools for clinicians and all actors requiring such skills, while working on **postures of openness**, **listening and humility**. Pedagogical approaches used by professors in clinical ethics, aim to work on reflexivity and patient partnership while including **writing exercises**, **roles plays**, **script**

concordance testing in other to meet the other of to tell one another. Professors compose a set of experts offering an interdisciplinary perspective, ranging from medical residents to patient partners, including experienced researchers in clinical ethics.

The CEPPP has developed an extensive patient partnership curriculum spanning 13 health programs and ranging from evaluation to workshops and case studies, as well as multiple CPD programs for clinicians, researchers and health improvement. In addition to this, it has developed different programs and courses in the Faculty of Medicine and School of Public health of University of Montreal, focused on patient and public partnership and engagement in the healthcare system. The CEPPP has developed a unique expertise in recruiting and training patients-astrainers and has maintained a training program called the Académie des patients.
